Title: UCGPC President

Term Duration: July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022

Compensation: \$300/mo. (\$3,600 total), travel reimbursed.

Estimated Workload: Approximately 20-30 hours per week, may vary.

Requirements: - Must be an enrolled student at a UC graduate or professional degree

program for entire term.

- The nomination must be made by a current member of the <u>UCGPC Board</u>.

Recommended Prior Experience:

- Engagement with a UC campus-based graduate and/or professional student government.

 Discussions or negotiations with UC systemwide individuals or student focused group (e.g. UC Office of the President, Academic Senate, Board of Regents, UAW 2865, Global Food Initiative).

- Engagement with the CA or federal legislative process.

- Leadership role in a student-driven group, association, or movement.

Recommended Skills:

- Proficiency in public communication, communicating with public officials.
- Organizational development.
- Student-centered advocacy and political advocacy.
- Time management, patience, and relationship building

Duties and Responsibilities: UCGPC Bylaws §2.3

- Serves as CEO of UCGPC.
- 2. Assists Council Chair with coordinating Council activities.
- 3. Calls and chairs meetings of UCGPC Officers.
- 4. Establishes and maintains communication with the UC President, Regents Chair, the Council of Chancellors, and Academic Senate Chair.
- 5. Establishes and maintains communication with other student organizations.
- 6. Signs letters, opinion/editorial submissions, and other official written communication on behalf of UCGPC.
- 7. Collaborates with member association Council representatives when making official statements or appearances representing the association in their campus or local media.
- 8. Make visits, in-person or virtually, to each member association.
- 9. Presents annual State of the Council at the UC Grad Summit.
- 10. Facilitates transition and onboarding of new Council of the next term.
